Planning, Evaluation, and Research

Purpose of Institutional Planning and Effectiveness

- A. To support a comprehensive institutional effectiveness process that utilizes the College's mission, vision, and core values as the foundation for planning, evaluation, and research.
- B. To provide a foundation for coordinating reports and research that supports planning and evaluation efforts.
- C. To ensure that continuous institutional evaluation and improvement is based on the evaluation and improvement model and uses accurate information in decision making and strategic planning.
- D. To ensure that the effectiveness of the College's research process is evaluated regularly and that the results are used for improving processes and services.

Policy

West Georgia Technical College will maintain a comprehensive institutional improvement process that ensures the following:

- A. A consistent and continuous process driven by the College's mission, vision, core values, and strategic goals;
- B. A process involving faculty, staff, administration, and students;
- C. A process utilizing research as an integral part of the institutional and planning process;
- D. A process ensuring that the evaluation model is reviewed regularly and that results are used for improving processes;
- E. The process intends to result in continuous improvement in the quality of the College's graduate and satisfaction of students, employees, and external constituents.

Responsibility

The Executive Director, Accreditation, Data, and Compliance has primary responsibility for coordinating institutional planning, evaluation, research, and completion of reports. In addition, the Executive Director has responsibility for ensuring that the effectiveness of the College's research process is evaluated to result in improving processes and services.
