Admission Criteria for Dental Hygiene (DH13)

Admission to West Georgia Technical College's Health Sciences and Nursing diploma and degree programs is based on a competitive selection process. There are minimum requirements for admission to individual Health Sciences and Nursing programs, and meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission to the program.

Non-Georgia residents shall be enrolled on a space-available basis and shall not displace any student desiring to enroll who is a resident of the state. This applies to programs with limited seating, such as competitive selection Health Sciences and Nursing programs and programs that have a waiting list. Please refer to the <u>In-State</u> <u>Residency section</u>¹ of the catalog for more information regarding residency status.

Competitive Selection Deadlines

- The Dental Hygiene program will admit once each year at the Douglas Campus.
- The deadline to apply is June 1st with a Fall semester cohort start date.

Competitive Selection Requirements

- Must be admitted to the college in good academic standing and regular status.
- Non-Georgia residents will be considered in the competitive selection process on a space available basis.
- Must complete the six (6) required courses and labs with a minimum grade of "C" or higher and have at least a 3.0 competitive GPA. (50% of process).
 - ENGL 1101, MATH 1111, BIOL 2113, BIOL 2113L, BIOL 2114, and BIOL 2114L are used to calculate the competitive GPA.
 - BIOL and CHEM courses must be completed within seven (7) years of the program cohort start date.
- Must complete the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) Exam with a minimum Adjusted Individual Total Score of 70% (50% of process).
 - TEAS Exam must be current within two (2) years of the program start date; maximum of three (3) attempts allowed per calendar year minimum of fourteen (14) days required between testing dates.
 - A copy of the highest earned TEAS Score Report must be attached to the Competitive Selection File Review Request Form. <u>WGTC will accept the highest TEAS score</u>.
 - Students may schedule the exam through <u>WGTC Community Education</u>.⁶
- Must possess a current CPR certification through the American Heart Association for Healthcare Providers-BLS (Basic Life Support).
 - A copy of current CPR Certification must be attached to the Competitive Selection File Review Request Form.
 - Online CPR certification will not be accepted.

Possible Bonus Points (Maximum of 3)

Submit an employer letter on company letterhead, include dates of employment, job title, and a brief description of duties for consideration:


- One (1) point for any dental clinical work experience or for at least forty (40) hours of clinical experience shadowing a Registered Dental Hygienist (RDH) within six (6) months of the student's application.
 - **Dental clinical experience** is defined as "physical patient care in a dental setting through an apprenticeship, observation, internship, part-time or full-time employment," or professional volunteerism that has been completed for at least three (3) months within three (3) years of the student's application.
 - **Professional volunteerism** is defined as "volunteering in a non-virtual dental office setting"; or for any healthcare clinical work experience.
- Two (2) points for dental related work experience such as a lab technician or front office employee within six (6) months to three (3) years of the student's application.
 -OR-
- Three (3) points for more than one-year equivalent of full-time experience as a chairside dental assistant within three (3) months to three (3) years of the student's application.



Competitive Selection Process

- 1. Must attend Mandatory Information session with WGTC Advising Coach.
- 2. Gather all supporting documentation including copies of current CPR card and TEAS Exam score and save electronically.
- 3. Complete <u>Competitive Selection File Review Request Form</u>⁷ and attach all supporting documents electronically on or before the deadline (direct questions related to the form to admissions@westgatech.edu).
- 4. Monitor student email and review competitive selection scoring sheet (this does not indicate acceptance or denial).
- 5. Allow 4-6 weeks from the program deadline date to receive acceptance or denial letter from the Admissions Office.
 - > If accepted, respond to secure your seat in the program by the given deadline.
 - If denied, meet with an Advising Coach to determine next steps. Students not selected into the program cohort must submit a new Competitive Selection File Review Request Form and required documentation to be included in the next selection process for the same program or the selection process for another program.
